### **BYLAW 2023-002**

Being a Bylaw of Vulcan County in the Province of Alberta to establish fees for services and information in the possession of Vulcan County.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 7(f) of the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, and amendments thereto, whereby a municipality may pass bylaws for municipal purposes respecting services provided by or on behalf of the municipality;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 8(c) of the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, and amendments thereto, whereby a municipality may by bylaw provide for a system of licenses, permits and approvals by establishing fees;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 630.1 of the Municipal Government Act, being Chapter M-26 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 2000, and amendments thereto, whereby a council may establish and charge fees for matters of planning;

AND WHEREAS the Council of Vulcan County deems it appropriate to establish a schedule of fees for services and information;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of Vulcan County, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled enacts as follows:

#### **Part 1 Fees for Administrative and General Purposes**

- a) THAT fees shall be charged for the provision of services and information in the possession of Vulcan County as set out in Part 1 of Schedule "A", attached to and forming a part of this bylaw

#### **Part 2 Planning and Development Fee Schedule**

- a) THAT fees shall be charged for the provision of services for matters dealing with planning, subdivision and rezoning as set out in Part 2 of Schedule "A", attached to and forming a part of this bylaw.

Part 3 Public Works Fee Schedule

- a) THAT fees shall be charged for the provision of services for matters dealing with public works as set out in Part 3 of Schedule "A", attached to and forming part of this bylaw.

Part 4 Agricultural Services Fees and Charges

- a) THAT fees shall be charged for the provision of services and equipment for matters dealing with agricultural services as set out in Part 4 of Schedule "A", attached to and forming part of this bylaw.

Part 5 Protective Services Fees and Charges

- a) THAT fees shall be charged for the provision of services and equipment for matters dealing with protective services as set out in Part 5 of Schedule "A", attached to and forming part of this bylaw.

Part 6 Definitions

- a) "Ratepayer" shall mean a registered property owner within the Vulcan County, and be limited to one person per property, regardless of the number of properties.

Part 7 Transition

- a) If a portion of this bylaw is found to be invalid, the invalid portion will be voided and the rest of the bylaw remains valid and effective.
- b) This bylaw comes into effect on January 1, 2023.
- c) Bylaws 2022-002 and 2022-004 are hereby rescinded.

The Chief Administrative Officer retains the right to review all emergency events and where extraordinary circumstances exist may adjust invoicing procedures other than the dollar amount listed herein.
