Roadside Hay Cutting Policy

- 1) Adjacent landowner or occupant has the first right to cut hay under a permit obtained before May 31.
- 2) Permits may be granted to non-adjacent landowners or occupants at the County's discretion.
- 3) Weed control remains the responsibility of the County.
- 4) Neither cut hay nor baled hay may be deposited on the travelled and maintained surface of the road.
- 5) Permit holder is responsible for the removal of hay bales by 5 days following baling.
- 6) Permit holder must carry out haying operations in such a manner that no hazard to traffic will exist.
- 7) Permit holder indemnifies and saves harmless Vulcan County from any claim arising out of the haying operation.
- 8) A fee may be charged for a permit.
- 9) Permits are in effect until August 15th of the year issued and will not be automatically renewed in the following year. Upon expiry, an extension may be requested by the permit holder to extend the permit until September 15th with valid reason.
- 10) Vulcan County has the right to cut and maintain vegetation on the road surface regardless of a hay permit without compensation to or consent of the permit holder.
- 11) Vulcan County reserves the right to cut and maintain vegetation on roadside slopes to a distance equivalent to one mower width of the cutter regardless of a hay permit without compensation to or consent of the permit holder.



ROADSIDE HAY CUTTING PERMIT

Terms and Conditions:

- 1. I will carry out having operations in such a manner that no hazard to traffic will exist.
- 2. I will indemnify and save harmless Vulcan County from and against any claim arising out of my operations.
- 3. I will not deposit cut hay or baled hay on the traveled and maintained surface of the road.
- 4. I will remove hay bales from the road allowance by 5 days following baling.
- 5. Weed control remains the responsibility of Vulcan County.
- 6. A permit is in effect until August 15th of the year issued and will not be automatically renewed in the following year. Upon expiry, an extension may be requested by the permit holder to extend the permit until September 15th with valid reason.
