May 20, 2026 Vulcan County Council Meeting

Delegations

The Intensive Livestock Working Group

Melody Garner- Skiba, Executive Director of the Intensive Livestock Working Group, presented to Council a Stock Talk project focusing on confined feeding operations (CFOs). The discussion emphasized the importance of improving public perception of confined feeding operations through education, engagement, and relationship-building.

Financial Matters

2026 First Quarter Reporting- APPROVED

Council reviewed the financial information for the three (3) months ending March 31, 2026. The actual figures have been compared to the approved final budget for the year and to the forecasted figures for the 1st quarter. Financial reporting is available on our [website](#).

Bylaws & Policies

Amendment to the Non-Residential Tax Exemption Incentive Bylaw 2026-018 - APPROVED

SECOND AND THIRD READING

Administration proposed amendments to the Non-Residential Tax Exemption Incentive Bylaw 2021-027, which currently creates tax incentives for non-residential developments within the County. The main amendment is to allow for greater flexibility in applications from Small Businesses to better utilize this opportunity. Rather than allowing applications only before construction begins, the amendments would allow applications up to 12 months after project completion. Council gave the bylaw second and third reading.

Legal Advice: ATIA S.32 - APPROVED

Council directs administration to schedule a new Public Hearing for Bylaw 2026-007 after being advised that there were technical concerns with part of the audio portion of the Public Hearing for Bylaw 2026-007 held on April 1, 2026. Council understands the importance of ensuring there is an opportunity for affected and other persons to make representations at a public hearing. The NEW Public Hearing will be held on June 10, 2026 at the Champion Community Hall, 106 2nd Street North, Champion, Alberta. The Public Hearing will commence at 1 p.m. Council further directs administration to provide notice that any of the oral or written submissions made at or in relation to the April 1, 2026 hearing will not be considered and only oral submissions made on June 10, 2026 and written submissions provided for the June 10, 2026 public hearing agenda package will be considered at the new Public Hearing.

Advocacy

Alberta Rural Health Week Proclamation- APPROVED

Vulcan County Council hereby proclaims May 25 to 29, 2026, as “Alberta Rural Health Week” in Vulcan County. Residents are encouraged to show appreciation, recognize, and celebrate rural health care professionals and community volunteers whose abilities and efforts enhance the quality of life in rural Alberta.

Service Agreement Renewal for the Vulcan District Waste Commission ATIA S. 30 - APPROVED

Council approved the 2026-2029 Service Agreement for the Vulcan District Waste Commission (VDWC) with amendments to Sections 2 and 4 as discussed in Closed Session. The agreement will be provided to the VDWC Board for consideration.

Municipal Reserve Land Remaining- APPROVED

Council directs administration to assist the interested purchaser with consulting other property owners to gauge interest in the purchase of Municipal Reserve Lands and bring forward a resolution to Council at a future meeting for the removal of municipal reserve designation from 9612380; 27MR.

April 22, 2026 Vulcan County Council Meeting

Delegations

Vulcan RCMP

Council received an update from Vulcan RCMP'S Sgt. Ryan Koehli, including:

- Property crime is at a five-year low; increases are noted in fraud, mental health calls, and domestic violence.
- Vulcan detachment remains fully staffed.
- PACT team continues to improve responses to mental health incidents.
- Court backlogs are delaying case outcomes.
- Real-Time Operations Centre enhancing frontline support and coordination.
- SAFE plan strengthening emergency preparedness in local schools.

KMPG Auditor Review

KPMG has completed the audit for the 2025 fiscal year. They were in attendance to present to Council once again another clean audit for Vulcan County. Pursuant to the MGA, the audited financial statements must be submitted to Municipal Affairs by May 1 each year.

Financial Matters

2025 Year-End Reporting - APPROVED

Administration has reviewed the County's financial statements for the year ending December 31, 2025, comparing actuals to the approved budget. To enhance transparency, the County has also launched an interactive Financial Reporting Dashboard that allows the public to explore financial data in detail through customizable, drill-down reporting.

Final 2026 Budget - APPROVED

The Budget Committee reviewed the 2026 Draft Operating and Capital Budgets on November 13, 2025, and finalized them at that meeting. The interim budget was approved on December 3, 2025. Work in Kind to Urban Municipalities Policy 12-2221 Amendment - APPROVED

Council approved Policy 12-2221 Work in kind for Economic Development in Urban Municipalities Policy with additional amendments. Vulcan County may provide in-kind support, including aggregates, equipment, labour, and technical expertise, for capital and maintenance projects in local urban municipalities. While not obligated, this support promotes regional collaboration, growth, and long-term community viability by helping attract businesses, services, and residents.

Advocacy

Declaration of Economic Development Week

Council declared May 4-8, 2026, as “Economic Development Week” in Vulcan County. Economic Development is the foundational work that helps to create jobs, support businesses, and improve the quality of life in communities. For the sixth year in a row, the Alberta Economic Development Association is calling on municipalities to formally recognize and celebrate May 4-8, 2026, as "Economic Development Week". Vulcan County has previously participated from 2022-2025.

Milo Estates Petition for Water Services

The Homeowners of Milo Estates (Plan 9612524 and Lot 2310322-2-21) have submitted a formal petition pursuant to the Municipal Government Act, requesting the installation of potable water services to the property line of each lot within the subdivision. Council accepted the Milo Estates Petition for Potable Water Services; and Council directed Administration to include Milo Estates in the potable water design currently being undertaken by MPE Engineering.

Agricultural

Weed Inspector Appointment

Council appointed Kyle Malmberg as Weed Inspector for Vulcan County for 2026 under the Weed Control Act of Alberta. Due to the large area Vulcan County encompasses it would be advantageous for the Agricultural Department to appoint an additional weed inspector for the 2026 growing season. In his position as Spray Crew Lead Hand, Kyle will assist the Agricultural Fieldman and Assistant Agricultural Fieldman in inspecting, monitoring and enforcing the Weed Control Act of Alberta on private and public property within Vulcan County.

Pest Inspector Appointment

Council appointed Kyle Malmberg as Pest Inspector for Vulcan County for 2026 under the Agricultural Pests Act of Alberta. In order to provide better coverage in inspecting, monitoring and enforcing the Agricultural Pests Act within the County, the Agricultural Department requested that an additional inspector be appointed by Council.

Irrigated Land Classification Reports

Council awarded the Irrigated Land Classification Reporting to Trace Associates Inc. at a cost of 8,137.50 (GST included), with funds to be drawn from General Capital Reserves. Two tax recovery parcels (SE 30-14-21-W4 and SW 30-14-21-W4) are being investigated for irrigation potential south of the Travers Reservoir. In accordance with the Alberta Water Act and the Irrigation Districts Act, a Land Classification for Irrigation Development report must be completed by a Professional Agrologist.

Strychnine Information Update

The Agriculture Department provided the following update to Council for information on Strychnine. On March of 2026, the PMRA and Alberta & Saskatchewan governments announced the return of 2% Liquid Strychnine for emergency use in 2026 and 2027. Strychnine will not be available until the end of May with the first shipment being no more than 800 cases. The second shipment is expected to arrive in July, and the third in the fall. Product will not be available to producers until July at the earliest. Mandatory training will be required for vendors and users. User training will be online and is estimated to begin on May 1st, 2026.
